

## The AFGRP website

The Aquaculture and Fish Genetics Research Programme website is now fully functional at <http://www.dfid.stir.ac.uk/afgrp>

Within this site, you can view information from current projects, download reports from many past and present projects as well as accessing references to programme outputs. The site carries a search facility at the bottom of each page to enable you to find just what you want quickly and easily from within the site.

On top of all these outputs, you can also find information about programme management, partner institutions and key research staff. There is a news section as well, which provides news of updates and is a place for anyone to post aquaculture related notices relevant to international development.
